This training will help you prepare for and pass the FAA's written exam which is required to obtain the **Remote Pilot Airman Certificate**. This is the credential you'll need to legally operate an unmanned aircraft for any purpose other than recreational.

This course will teach you the rules of airspace, aerodynamics, aircraft maintenance, emergency procedures and the principles of unmanned aviation. You will also be trained in the applicable state and federal laws, best practices, policies and how to avoid the common mistakes that cause crashes.

This course is suited for Public Safety (Police, Fire, Rescue, Emergency Government), Municipal Government, Parks Departments and Conservation Wardens.
